PRESIDENT'S CORNER

PVD Tower Tour and Fire Safety Demo

This month, we have an exciting meeting planned. It will take place at the PVD Airport Fire Station (directions are enclosed). There will be a tower tour for those that arrive early, followed by a safety demo by the fire department staff, and a dinner catered by Cellos. No alcohol will be served due to the logistics of the location. The tower tour is limited to **45 people maximum**, and it will be first-come, first-served, so please arrive early. We will be taking three groups of 15 people over in vans starting at 6:15 pm. To visit the tower, you must be a **US Citizen with a valid Photo ID**.

Next month, we will hold the FAA Master Pilot Award (or Wright Brothers Award) ceremony at Cellos Restaurant. Jack Keenan from the Boston FSDO will present the awards. We have submitted applications for 6 pilots. As you may know, this award recognizes pilots with 50 years of continuous pilot experience without accident or incident. So these are some of the most experienced and safest pilots around. It is a great testimony to the RIPA organization that we are able to submit this many qualified candidates again this year.



I thought this would be a good time to bring up an issue that we have been asked as an organization to address. I was approached individually by one of the PVD tower controllers a couple of months ago and asked if RIPA would support the National Air Traffic Controllers Association (NATCA) in their labor dispute with the FAA. As pilots, we have to work with both ATC and the FAA, so it puts us in a precarious position to support one side or the other. My response as RIPA President is that it would not be right for our organization to take sides in this labor dispute. However, I would like to pass this message on to our membership so that you can read up on the issue and contact your congressmen if you feel compelled to do so. I personally am not familiar with the negotiations, but from what I have read online, the arbitration has reached an impasse and has been sent onto congress to resolve the issue.
