DINNER MEETING – October 12, 2004

Paul Tocco, President, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM at Chelo's Restaurant on Post Road in Warwick, RI. Dan Scanlon, Treasurer, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag and we observed a moment of silence. After introductions of the 46 members and guests, Paul thanked Marilyn Biagetti and Dee Scanlon, the hosts for the night. A motion to approve the minutes of the September 14, 2004 RIPA dinner meeting was seconded and passed.

Dan Scanlon reported a balance of \$6,023.78 in the general account and \$1,845.39 in the Scholarship account. A motion to approve the report was seconded and passed.
